Lc 13,22-30



Jesús iba recorriendo pueblos y ciudades rumbo a Jerusalén. En cada uno de ellos se detenía un momento para platicar con la gente. En uno de esos pueblos alguien le pregunta: ¿son pocos los que se salvan? Pero por la respuesta de Jesús, nos damos cuenta que para el, lo importante no es “cuanto se salvaran” sino “como hemos de buscar salvarnos”. Y es muy claro en decir que será a través de nuestro esfuerzo y sacrificio por hacer el bien, pues “los que hacen el mal” quedaran fuera del reino de Dios.

Para salvarnos no será suficiente con “guardar las apariencias”, por ejemplo yendo a misa sin fervor, escuchando la palabra de Dios sin ponerla en práctica; hacer buenas obras solo para ser admirados.
