**BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST
JUNE 10, 2007**

"In those days, Melchizedek, King of Salem, brought out bread and wine, and being a priest of the God Most High, he blessed Abram with these words; 'Blessed be Abram by God Most High, the Creator of Heaven and earth, and blessed be God Most High, who delivered your foes into your hand.' Then Abram gave him a tenth of everything' ...'As often as you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the death of the Lord until He comes.'"

The figure of Melchizedek, priest and king, is presented just prior to God making His covenant with Abram. The elements of bread and wine seem significant as they were those used by Jesus at the Last Supper in the establishment of the new covenant, and are the same used as we renew the covenant in our worship.

Bread and wine, food and drink, elements of hospitality and essentials for life's journey, offer growth, strength and health. What they provide for us physically is not dissimilar to the gift of the Eucharist for my spiritual life. My participation in the Eucharist leads to growth in union with Christ and with others with whom I am in communion. It empowers me to live as a faithful witness to the God who comes to live in me. It enables me to live as an instrument of justice and righteousness in relationship with my world. Through my baptism I share with Christ as priest, prophet and king.

Presencia Real de Jesucristo

Para entender bien el sentido de la celebración eucarística es necesario tener en cuenta la presencia de Cristo y Su acción en la misma.

Al pronunciar el sacerdote las palabras de la consagración, su fuerza es tal, que Cristo se hace presente tal cual, bajo las substancias del pan y del vino. Es decir, vivo, real y substancialmente. En Cuerpo, Sangre, Alma y Divinidad, por lo tanto, donde está su Cuerpo, está su Sangre, su Alma y su Divinidad. Él está presente en todas las hostias consagradas del mundo y aún en la partícula más pequeña que podamos encontrar. Así, Cristo se encuentra en todas las hostias guardadas en el Sagrarios, mientras que el pan, signo sensible, no se corrompa.

El mandato de Cristo de: *"Hacer esto en memoria mía"* fue tan contundente, que desde los inicios, los primeros cristianos se reunían para celebrar "la fracción del pan". Y, pasó a hacer parte, junto con el Bautismo, del rito propio de los cristianos.
