**SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER  
MAY 13, 2007**

"...we will come to Him and make our home with Him ... The Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in My name, will teach you everything and remind you of all that I told you ... It is the decision of the Holy Spirit and of us not to place on you any burden beyond these necessities."

The life of the primitive church reflects that of our church today. There were struggles and misunderstandings, the need for dialogue and listening, discernment and decisions. The single thread woven throughout all the years is the acknowledgement of the presence and influence of the Holy Spirit.

Jesus made a promise to His first followers. The promise included the sending of the Spirit, in His name. Its purpose to teach and remind. Our Holy Father and the Magisterium of the church continue to provide for our need. At times, the reminders are gentle and sometimes are quite strong. We listen to the Spirit's voice. We hear sounds concerning the need for a new evangelization, teaching about peace, directions to alleviate the sufferings of the poor – all make the presence of the Spirit real.

As the Spirit guided the first Christians, directing that we not be burdened but freed as the children of a loving God, so today the Spirit's presence in our church carries out this same function. The teaching and reminders must be brought to the marketplace, the real world so in need of the Spirit's presence.

It is one thing to have the Spirit being sent. It is something more to have the teaching and reminders ratified and accepted by all, allowing Him to make His home in us. Our computer keys are equipped to have a

message sent, but just as easily it can be deleted as too challenging, costly or radical.

Before we commemorate the Ascension of the Lord, may we be reminded to seek the Spirit once again.
