Los Saduceos formaban un pequeño grupo de hombres importantes quienes eran parte del sanedrín, y que a pesar de ser estudiosos de la religión, no creían en la resurrección de los muertos. Por eso le preguntan a Cristo que pasara después de que resucite una viuda que tuvo por maridos a siete hombres ¿de quien de ellos será esposa en la vida eterna? Jesús nos deja bien claro con su respuesta que: no hay duda que la resurrección existe para quien se haga merecedora de ella. Y que en la otra vida ya no será importante lo material, sino lo del espíritu, pues seremos como “Ángeles”.

Hay verdades de nuestra fe que rebasan nuestro entendimiento. No basta estudiar mucho la palabra de Dios para entenderlas, es necesario simplemente “Creer”. Una de ellas es la resurrección. Y de ella Jesús nos dice que será una vida espiritual. Es decir, una vida llena del amor de Dios.

La vida terrena, nuestro espíritu a veces se de dominado por nuestro cuerpo y nuestros intereses egoístas, empujándonos a olvidarnos de lo importante: amar a Dios y a nuestros hermanos.
