Those who contributed to the Bicentennial Campaign with a one-time donation last year might be able to make another, similar donation this year. Those who have not yet donated to the Bicentennial Campaign are encouraged to do so this year. And, we want to remind all donors to the Campaign to keep their payments up-to-date.

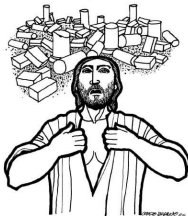

Como ahora, en tiempos de Jesús, las grandes obras materiales que construimos los hombres, maravillaban y hacían que mas de uno pensara que a través de ellas se estaba sirviendo y adorando a Dios. Jesús los ubica al explicarles que todo eso es efímero y desaparecerá tarde o temprano. Preocupados (como muchos de nosotros), sobre cuando llegara el final de los tiempos, le piden pistas a Cristo. Cristo dice que esto no siempre será fácil. Habrá ocasiones en que seamos ofendidos, atacados, incluso en que nuestras buenas intenciones sean correspondidas con malas actitudes, pero que si perseveramos en nuestro amor a Dios, El siempre nos protegerá.
