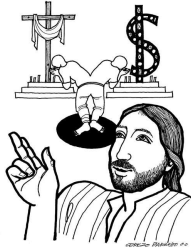

Una vez más Jesús habla a sus discípulos con una parábola, y una vez más, es para explicarles como debe ser usado el dinero. La parábola del administrador deshonesto no la uso Jesús para alabar las malas acciones del administrador, sino para hacernos ver que, gracias a su astucia, uso el dinero para hacer el bien y rescatar su salvación. Para Jesús, el dinero debe verse como lo que es: un medio para servir a los hombres, y con ellos a Dios.

El dinero y todo lo que con el se compra, no es ni malo, ni bueno, es un medio que Dios nos da para administrar, y que lo podemos usar para hacer el bien o para hacer el mal. Y se usa para hacer el mal cuando nos llega a importar tanto que se convierte en nuestro dios, es decir que estamos dispuestos a todo, con tal de obtenerlo: a robar, a engañar, a ofender y a abusar de los demás.

Cristo nos dice que el dinero (y todo lo que con el se compra), es para compartirlo y hacer el bien a los demás. Y se usa así, cuando amamos a Dios y a los hombres más que al mismo dinero. Cuando el dinero se usa como lo que es: un medio para compartir, ayudar, desarrollar, estamos siendo “fieles administradores” entonces Dios no solo pondrá a nuestro cargo bienes materiales para administrar, sino dones mucho más importantes como su espíritu Santo que nos ayuda a buscar y hacer el bien.

El dinero como todo lo material, dejara de sernos útil cuando muramos, pro nuestras buenas acciones, será la llave que nos abra la puerta al cielo.

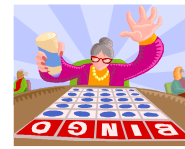
