LECTURAS PARA EL DIA DE HOY:

1 Lectura: Dt 11,18.26-28.32: Pongo delante maldición y bendición

2 Lectura: Rm 3,21-25a.28: Somos justificados por la fe

Evangelio: Mt 7,21-27: No basta decir «Señor, Señor»



En la **primera lectura** se nos presenta una parte de es gran discurso de despedida de Moisés que viene a ser el libro del Deuteronomio. En él se dirige al pueblo con una exhortación que habla de la maldición o la bendición que proceden de seguir o no a Dios en fidelidad. Nosotros somos libres de elegir nuestro estilo y sistema de vida; pero debemos ser conscientes del costo de nuestra libertad de opción. Toda elección es a la vez una renuncia. Elegimos una opción gracias a que desechamos las demás que nos eran posibles. No es posible elegir sin renunciar. Es un riesgo inevitable. El riesgo de vivir, porque vivir es elegir, y renunciar. Es decir: nuestra vida no está hecha. La tenemos que hacer día a día. Al ritmo de cada elección.

Por lo que se refiere a Dios, él ya hizo sus opciones fundamentales, que deben ser nuestra guía existencial: por la Vida, por el Amor, por la Justicia, por el Mundo, por la Comunión universal. **Pablo** es consciente de lo que Dios hizo en Jesucristo, y cómo por medio de su sacrificio ha justificado a la humanidad, la cual, por muchas leyes y cumplimiento de preceptos que hiciera por sí

misma, no era capaz de justificarse, de salvarse. El apóstol reitera esta dinámica de Dios para con el género humano, con el afán de que los creyentes se den cuenta de que gracias a la gratitud del amor del Padre somos herederos de la salvación. Un elemento importante será la fe, la cual es capaz de interpretar y leer la acción cotidiana de Dios a nuestro favor en la historia, en la cual, afirma, definitivamente justifica sin distinción a todos los que creen.

El **evangelio** de hoy, de Mateo, nos presenta la sección final del largo sermón de la montaña. Todo el fragmento que hoy leemos está centrado en el tema de «la primacía del hacer sobre el decir». Es un evangelio con el que sintoniza inmediatamente la cultura moderna: aunque todo es importante, lo más importante no es decir, interpretar o reinterpretar, sino hacer, construir, amar efectivamente; no decir que amamos.
