LECTURAS PARA EL DIA DE HOY:

1 Lectura: Dt 8,2-3.14b-16a: Te alimentó con el maná

2 Lectura: 1Co 10,16-17: El pan es uno, igual nosotros

Evangelio: Jn 6,51-58: Mi carne es verdadera comida



Hoy, todo el mensaje que hemos de escuchar y vivir está contenido en "el pan". El capítulo sexto del Evangelio según san Juan refiere el milagro de la multiplicación de los panes, seguido de un gran discurso de Jesús, uno de cuyos fragmentos escuchamos hoy. Nos interesa mucho entenderle, no sólo para vivir la fiesta del "Corpus" y el sacramento de la Eucaristía, sino también para comprender uno de los mensajes centrales de su Evangelio.

Hay multitudes hambrientas que necesitan pan. Hay toda una humanidad abocada a la muerte y al vacío, carente de esperanza, que necesita a Jesucristo. Hay un Pueblo de Dios creyente y caminante que necesita encontrarle visiblemente para seguir viviendo de Él y alcanzar la vida. Tres clases de hambre y tres experiencias de saciedad, que corresponden a tres formas de pan: el pan material, el pan que es la persona de Jesucristo y el pan eucarístico. Sabemos que el pan más importante es Jesucristo. Sin Él no podemos vivir de ninguna manera: Pero Él mismo quiso dar de comer al hambriento y, además, hizo de ello un imperativo evangélico fundamental. Seguramente pensaba que era una buena manera de revelar y verificar el amor de Dios que salva. Pero también quiso hacerse

accesible a nosotros en forma de pan, para que, quienes aún caminamos en la historia, permanezcamos en ese amor y alcancemos así la vida. Quería ante todo enseñarnos que hemos de buscarle y vivir de Él; quiso demostrar su amor dando de comer al hambriento, ofreciéndose asiduamente en la Eucaristía.
