**Cemetery**

The following letter has been sent to all registered parishioners and to those who have loved ones buried in our parish cemetery.

August 6, 2009

Dear Parishioner,

Unlike so many other parishes in the metropolitan area, our community is blessed to own a beautiful cemetery in which to entrust our loved ones for their earthly rest. Thousands of our dearly departed now slumber in our two parish burial grounds, which we endeavor to maintain with dignity and tranquility.

Volunteers have come together to further improve the new cemetery on Washington Avenue by erecting a modest, open-air memorial chapel that will receive bereaved families when inclement weather, impassable roads or other issues (e.g. family members confined to wheelchairs) keep them from being able to access the upper reaches of the cemetery. In addition, the chapel will serve as a place of quiet contemplation for those visiting the cemetery during other times.

The 20' by 20' structure will be constructed of maintenance-free materials, and will feature modest benches and proper facilities in order to conduct services for those times when physically accessing the grave is too difficult. The projected minimal cost for this project is \$20,000. I recognize that it may seem unwise to launch this project in the midst of these difficult times, but I also know that many generous parishioners working together for a common goal here at St. Joachim and St. John always seem to somehow make the seemingly impossible quite possible.

And so with great humility, I ask you to consider becoming one of the donors who will make this project a reality. We seek 100 generous parishioners to each donate \$200. Every donor will have their name memorialized in the chapel. If additional funds are raised, they will be earmarked for amenities such as proper landscaping, walkways, statues, etc. Time is of the essence, as we would like to dedicate the chapel on All Souls Day, November 2, 2009.

I know that much is asked of each of us: our time, our talent and our treasure. I would not ask your help with this particular project if I did not believe it is truly a legacy endeavor that will make a lasting impact on the families who follow us in faith here in

## 20 DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO

### LECTURAS PARA EL DIA DE HOY:

**1 Lectura: Prov 9,1-6:** "Coman de mi pan"

**2 Lectura: Ef 5,15-20:** "Dense cuenta de lo que el Señor quiere"

**Evangelio: Jn 6,51-58:** "Yo lo resucitaré el último día"

"Yo soy el pan vivo, bajado del cielo. Si uno come de este pan, vivirá para siempre"



Hoy continuamos con la lectura del Discurso del pan de vida que nos ocupa en estos domingos: «Yo soy el pan vivo, bajado del cielo». Tiene una estructura, incluso literaria, muy bien pensada y llena de ricas enseñanzas. ¡Qué bonito sería que los cristianos conociésemos mejor la Sagrada Escritura! Nos encontraríamos con el mismo Misterio de Dios que se nos da como verdadero alimento de nuestras almas, con frecuencia amodorradas y hambrientas de eternidad. Es fantástica esta Palabra Viva, la única Escritura capaz de cambiar los corazones.

Jesucristo, que es Camino, Verdad y Vida, habla de sí mismo diciéndonos que es Pan. Y el pan, como bien sabemos, se hace para comerlo. Y para comer debemos recordarlo, hay que tener hambre. ¿Cómo podremos entender qué significa, en el fondo, ser cristiano, si hemos perdido el hambre de Dios? Hambre de conocerle, hambre de tratarlo como a un buen Amigo, hambre de darlo a conocer, hambre de compartirlo, como se comparte el pan de la mesa. ¡Qué bella estampa ver al cabeza de familia cortando un buen pan, que antes se ha ganado con el esfuerzo de su trabajo, y lo da a manos llenas a sus hijos! Ahora, pues, es Jesús quien se da como Pan de Vida, y es Él mismo quien da la medida, y quien se da con una generosidad que hace temblar de emoción.

Pan de Vida, ¿de qué Vida? Está claro que no nos alargará ni un día más nuestra permanencia en esta tierra; en todo caso, nos cambiará la calidad y la hondura de cada instante de nuestros días. Preguntémonos con honestidad: Y yo, ¿qué vida quiero para mí? Y comparémosla con la orientación real con que vivimos. ¿Es esto lo que querías? ¿No crees que el horizonte puede ser todavía mucho más amplio? Pues mira: mucho más aun que todo lo que podamos imaginar tú y yo juntos... mucho más llena... mucho más hermosa... mucho más... es la Vida de Cristo palpitando en la Eucaristía. Y allí está, esperándonos para ser comido, esperando en la puerta de tu corazón, paciente, ardiente como quien sabe amar. Y después de esto, la Vida eterna: «El que coma este pan vivirá para siempre». **¿Qué más quieres?**

**ORACION:** *Oh Dios, Padre nuestro, Madre nuestra: Tú quieres que nuestra Comunidad sea ejemplo de fraternidad, de común-uniión, de compartir, de vivir la eucaristía como fuente y culmen de nuestra vida cristiana. Tú, que partes para nosotros y repartes el pan y la palabra para alimentarnos y renovarnos, haznos cada día más coherentes con nuestra propia Humanidad. Por Jesucristo Nuestro señor. Amen.*
