**"SEÑOR, ¿A QUIEN IREMOS? TU TIENES PALABRAS DE VIDA ETERNA"**



Hoy, el Evangelio nos sitúa en Cafarnaúm, donde Jesús es seguido por muchos por haber visto sus milagros, en especial por la multiplicación espectacular de los panes. Socialmente, Jesús allí tiene el riesgo de morir de éxito, como se dice frecuentemente; incluso lo quieren nombrar rey. Es un momento clave dentro de la catequesis de Jesús. Es el momento en el que comienza a exponer con toda claridad la dimensión sobrenatural de su mensaje. Y, como que Jesús es tan buen catequista, sacerdote perfecto, el mejor obispo y papa, les deja marchar, siente pena, pero Él es fiel a su mensaje, el éxito popular no lo ciega.

Con humildad y confianza digámosle al buen Jesús que queremos serle fieles hoy, mañana y todos los días; que nos haga ver el poco sentido evangélico que tiene discutir las enseñanzas de Dios o de la Iglesia por el hecho de que "no los entiendo":

Como Pedro, nosotros sabemos que Jesús nos habla con lenguaje sobrenatural, lenguaje que hay que sintonizar correctamente para entrar en su pleno sentido; en caso contrario sólo oímos ruidos incoherentes y desagradables; hay que afinar la sintonía. Como Pedro, también en nuestra vida de

cristianos tenemos momentos en los que hay que renovar y manifestar que estamos en Jesús y que queremos seguir con Él. Pedro amaba a Jesucristo, por eso se quedó; los otros lo querían por el pan, por los "caramelos", por razones políticas y lo dejan. El secreto de la fidelidad es amar, confiar. Pidamos hoy y ahora a ser fieles a la Iglesia que tenemos.
