Lenten Information

Fasting – prescribes only one full meal plus two small ones to maintain strength. The two small meals should not equal a full meal in quantity. Obliges from 18th to 59th birthdays.

Abstinence forbids eating meat on a particular day. Obliges from 14th birthday.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast and abstinence.

All Fridays in Lent are days of abstinence. There is a serious obligation to observe these penitential practices in a serious way.

The Daily Lenten Meditation "Black Books" are available (free) in the vestibules of the churches. Many parishioners have found these booklets very helpful in the past.

LECTURAS PARA EL DIA DE HOY:

1 Lectura: **Is 43,18-19.21-22.24b-25:**

"Por mi cuenta borraré tus crímenes"

2 Lectura: **2Cor 1,18-22:** "En él todo se ha convertido en un "sí"

Evangelio: Mc 2,1-12: "Tus pecados te son perdonados".

«Y le vienen a traer a un paralítico llevado entre cuatro»



Hoy, leyendo el Evangelio, centramos nuestra atención en tres mementos concretos: un paralítico que no se vale por sí mismo, un grupo de amigos, y Jesús. En el paralítico nos podemos ver reflejados cada uno de nosotros; todos podemos estar paralizados, ya que el pecado nos paraliza en nuestro camino hacia Dios. A veces, no nos damos cuenta o nos parece que ya estamos bien como estamos, o que ya solucionaremos o pondremos en orden nuestras relaciones con Dios en otra ocasión. Entonces, «le vienen a traer a un paralítico llevado entre cuatro». Necesitamos verdaderos amigos que nos lleven a Dios, que venzan nuestra resistencia. El paralítico, después de ver el jaleo que estaban ocasionando los amigos, seguro que debía decirles que pararan, que ya habría más tiempo otro día, que había mucha gente... Y no digamos nada cuando «abrieron el techo encima de donde Él estaba»: el ruido que harían, el polvo, las molestias para todos los que estaban allí y los gritos que harían los asistentes, pues no les dejaban escuchar a Jesús, etc.

Pero los auténticos amigos no encuentran dificultades, aman de verdad y quieren lo mejor, porque «es propio del amigo hacer el bien a los amigos, principalmente a aquellos que se encuentran más necesitados». Preguntémonos hoy si nosotros tenemos verdaderos amigos que serán capaces de llevarnos a Dios. Preguntémonos, también, si somos amigos de verdad y nos esforzamos para llevar a quienes amamos a Dios. No conviene olvidar que también ellos pondrán resistencia. ¿Soy realmente amigo? ¿Pueden los otros confiar en que les ayudaré a estar cerca de Jesús?. Santa María, Madre de Dios y Madre nuestra, nos lleva y nos da a Jesús: ¡que con su ayuda también nosotros llevemos a todos a Jesús!

MIÉRCOLES DE CENIZA: Recuerden que este Miércoles 25 de Febrero es miércoles de ceniza y tendremos la santa misa en los siguientes horarios:

San Joaquín: 7:00 a.m y 7:00 p.m en Ingles.

San Juan: 8:00 a.m, 12:00 y 3:00 p.m Ingles y 7:00 p.m en Español.

Ayuno: obliga a hacer una sola comida durante el día, pero no prohíbe tomar un poco de alimento por la mañana y por la noche. La ley del ayuno obliga a todos los mayores de edad hasta que hayan cumplido 59 años. Son días de ayuno y abstinencia el miércoles de Ceniza y el Viernes Santo.

Abstinencia: prohíbe el uso de carnes, pero no el uso de huevos, laticinios y cualquier condimento a base de grasa de animales. Obliga a los mayores de 14 años. Son días de abstinencia todos los viernes de Cuaresma.

Estas mortificaciones mínimas de ayuno y abstinencia deben ser completadas por cada uno según las personales necesidades y exigencias espirituales. La Cuaresma no es sólo tiempo de mortificación. Es, además, tiempo de retiro espiritual en el que la meditación y la oración personal deben ser intensificadas para lograr la renovación espiritual que se anhela conseguir durante este tiempo
