Our Parish Cemetery

Thanks to all of you who are following the revised rules regarding flowers, etc. placed at your loved ones graves. The Cemetery Board hopes the cemetery will be maintained as a peaceful place of rest and respect for all those buried there. As a reminder, artificial flowers, balloons, and glass containers are not permitted for safety reasons. Nor are arrangements/pots containing styrofoam.

Flags are permitted from Memorial Day through Independence Day and again on Veteran's Day. All flags should be removed by July 11. Following these rules regarding flags helps decrease litter and the associated disrespect to the torn/damaged flags. We appreciate your cooperation.
