HIS WORD TODAY *by Rev. William J. Reilly*

“When they all saw Him, they worshipped, but they doubted. Then Jesus approached and said to them: ‘All power in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always...’”

Listening to the gospel today we find that we go back to the post Easter, pre Ascension meeting of Jesus. The Spirit of Pentecost had not yet come. The docile apostles went to meet the Lord at a specific place. How often the Lord revealed His presence and might at mountain sites in both testaments.

The Easter description that they were incredulous prevails, but the special moment had come. Jesus speaks. The commissioning takes place as He confers His power on the eleven and to the church of today. Those who had been told to wait in the city until the Spirit came are being sent to make disciples. There are three steps to take. They are to invite others to share in their oneness with Jesus Christ. Through Baptism they will begin to live the life, which Jesus came to bring. They are to be teachers of the message of salvation as proclaimed by the Person of Christ. He then would take leave of them.

What happened on that mountain continues today. The mission of Christ the Redeemer is that of the church and its members of our time. The teaching role of the church never ends, as all are called to know the Person of Jesus. The Bishops of the United States have reminded us that we are entrusted with this task to enthuse, invite and include all in our time in the work of evangelizing. Their teaching ‘Go and Make Disciples’ provides a fine framework for this to happen. He said He would be with us to carry out His work.

Flag Day

Flag Day, a day set aside to honor the flag of our country, is Sunday, June 14. This is a tribute to our flag.

I am the flag of the United States of America, My name is “Olde Glory.”

I fly atop the world’s tallest buildings. I stand watch in America’s Halls of Justice. I fly majestically over the Great Institutions of Learning. I stand guard with the Greatest Military Power in the world. LOOK UP and SEE ME!!

I have been soiled, burned, torn and trampled on the streets of countries that I have helped to set free. It does not hurt, for I am invincible. I have been soiled, burned, torn, and trampled on the streets of my own country. When this is done by those with whom I have served in battle, it HURTS.

But I shall overcome, for I am strong! I have slipped the surely bonds of earth and from my vantage point on the moon I stand watch over the New Frontiers of space. I have been in the silent witness to all of American’s finest hours. But my finest hour comes when I am torn into strips to be used as bandages for my wounded comrades on the Field of Battle; when I fly half-mast to honor my Sailor, Marine or Soldier; and when I lie in the trembling arms of the Grieving Mother – at the graveside of her fallen son or daughter. I am Proud! My name is “Olde Glory.” Long may I wave, Dear God. Long may I wave.

1 Lectura: Dt 4,32-34.39-40: "El Señor es el único Dios; no hay otro"

Evangelio: Mt 28,16-20: "Hagan discípulos entre todos los pueblos"



Esto de la Trinidad, tal y como lo han predicado, suena a «música celestial». Es un misterio, se ha dicho; no hay quien lo entienda. Al fin y al cabo, por mucho que nos esforcemos, nunca vamos a poder desvelarlo. «Un sólo Dios y tres personas distintas. El Padre es Dios, el Hijo es Dios y el Espíritu Santo es Dios. Tres personas distintas y un solo Dios verdadero».

Dios no es algo, sino alguien. Nos lo dijo Jesús: "Cuando oréis decid: Padre, que a Dios se le llamaba «padre» estaba dicho y descubierto muchos siglos antes de Jesús.

Dios es también Hijo. Dicho de otro modo, Dios es dependiente. En toda familia, el hijo depende al nacer de los padres, pero, para subsistir como persona, tiene que cortar el cordón umbilical. Dependencia originaria y autonomía consecuente. En nuestra sociedad se da actualmente un rechazo del padre por parte de los hijos, de la autoridad por parte de los gobernados; se puede hablar ya de un mundo que abandona su ser patriarcal. En la Trinidad divina no sucede así. El Hijo no rechaza al Padre. Es camino e imagen del mismo. "Quien me ve a mí ve al Padre". No hay dominación sufrida por el hijo, ni anarquía reivindicada en Jesús. Hay amor que lo iguala todo, gracias al Espíritu.

Dios, finalmente, es Espíritu. Como viento y fuego, calor, libertad, amor. Sin el Espíritu la relación Padre-Hijo se convertiría en tortura y martirio de frialdad y desamor.

Y aquí es donde la Trinidad se convierte en lección de vida ciudadana. Autoridad y paternidad en nuestra sociedad, sí; pero no autoritarismo ni paternalismo. Dependencia de hijos a padres, pero sin atentar contra la autonomía de cada uno. Y sobre todo amor, libertad, escucha, calor de hogar.

Oración: Señor, Dios, que eres nuestro Padre, nuestro Hermano Jesucristo y el Espíritu que nos consuela y nos fortalece; ayúdanos a vivir en auténtica y sincera comunidad, y que lo que celebramos en la liturgia lo expresamos en toda nuestra vida, que traduzcamos nuestra fe en obras de justicia y amor, que no busquemos sólo en tener una fe correcta sino, sobre todo, una vida correcta, que sea siempre y en todo conforme a tu voluntad de que todos seamos hermanos. Por Jesucristo Nuestro Señor. Amen.
