Swine Flu Concerns

Due to concerns about the Swine Flu virus, some parishioners have asked if they should refrain from shaking hands during the sign of peace at Mass. It is important to emphasize that the invitation to offer the sign of peace permits the individual parishioner to choose how that sign will be expressed. For example, some parishioners may choose to wave their hand or nod their head as a sign of peace. While shaking hands is not obligatory, it is another acceptable expression of the sign of peace. Consequently, those parishioners who are concerned about spreading the flu virus by shaking hands at the sign of peace should express peace in another manner. The faithful are also advised to practice good hygiene and hand washing, and if they are ill, they should not receive from the cup if Holy Communion is offered under both species.

Hoy, nuevamente, Jesús trastoca nuestros esquemas. Provocadas por Santiago y Juan, han llegado hasta nosotros estas palabras llenas de autenticidad: «Tampoco el Hijo del hombre ha venido a ser servido, sino a servir y a dar su vida».

¡Cómo nos gusta estar bien servidos! Pensemos, por ejemplo, en lo agradable que nos resulta la eficacia, puntualidad y pulcritud de los servicios públicos; o nuestras quejas cuando, después de haber pagado un servicio, no recibimos lo que esperábamos. Jesucristo nos enseña con su ejemplo. Él no sólo es servidor de la voluntad del Padre, que incluye nuestra redención, isino que además paga! Y el precio de nuestro rescate es su Sangre, en la que hemos recibido la salvación de nuestros pecados. ¡Gran paradoja ésta, que nunca llegaremos a entender! Él, el gran rey, el Hijo de David, el que había de venir en nombre del Señor, «se despojó de su grandeza, tomó la condición de esclavo y se hizo semejante a los hombres haciéndose obediente hasta la muerte, y una muerte de cruz».

Jesús trastoca de tal manera las categorías de este mundo que también resitúa el sentido de la actividad humana. No es mejor el encargo que más brilla, sino el que realizamos más identificados con Jesucristo-

siervo, con mayor Amor a Dios y a los hermanos.
