**Jesús les dice: "Venid y comed"**

Hoy, tercer Domingo de Pascua, contemplamos todavía las apariciones del Resucitado, este año según el evangelista Juan, en el impresionante capítulo veintiuno, todo él impregnado de referencias sacramentales, muy vivas para la comunidad cristiana de la primera generación, aquella que recogió el testimonio evangélico de los mismos Apóstoles.

Éstos, después de los acontecimientos pascuales, parece que retornan a su ocupación habitual, como habiendo olvidado que el Maestro los había convertido en "pescadores de hombres". Un error que el evangelista reconoce, constatando que a pesar de haberse esforzado «no pescaron nada». Era la noche de los discípulos. Sin embargo, al amanecer, la presencia conocida del Señor le da la vuelta a toda la escena. Simón Pedro, que antes había tomado la iniciativa en la pesca infructuosa, ahora recoge la red llena.

Así, cuando bajo la mirada del Señor glorificado y con su autoridad, los Apóstoles, con la primacía de Pedro manifestada en la triple profesión de amor al Señor ejercen su misión evangelizadora, se produce el milagro: "pescan hombres". Los peces, una vez pescados, mueren cuando se los saca de su medio. Así mismo, los seres humanos también mueren si nadie los rescata de la oscuridad y de la asfixia, de una existencia alejada de Dios y envuelta de absurdidad, llevándolos a la luz, al aire y al calor de la vida. De la vida de Cristo, que él mismo alimenta desde la playa de su gloria, figura espléndida de la vida sacramental de la Iglesia y, primordialmente, de la Eucaristía. En ella el Señor da personalmente el pan y, con él, se da a sí mismo, como indica la presencia del pez, que para la primera comunidad cristiana era un símbolo de Cristo y, por tanto, del cristiano.
