A FRESH PERSPECTIVE ON THE SUNDAY READINGS

HIS WORD TODAY by Rev. William J. Reilly

FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

April 25, 2010

“It was necessary that the word of God be spoken to you first, but since you reject it and condemn yourselves as unworthy of eternal life, we now turn to the Gentiles. For so the Lord has commanded us, ‘I have made you a light to the Gentiles, that you may be an instrument of salvation to the ends of the earth.’ The Gentiles were delighted when they heard this, and glorified the name of the Lord.”

When children pause to play, they create their own set of rules; it is not rare to have one say ‘you must do this’ or ‘you must do that.’ The words of the two apostles to the Gentiles reflect a similar style and instruction.

Paul and Barnabas attended their Jewish worship services on consecutive Sabbaths. Knowing their friends, they urged them to remain faithful to their calling. When disagreement arose, they both challenged their dissenters, accusing them of rejecting the Word of God and the gift of eternal life. Attention now will be directed to the Gentiles. There are only two options – accept or reject.

Rereading this text I ask myself about my acceptance of the Word of God. Do I pick and choose what appeals to me and turn away from the challenges? Do I seek the gift of eternal life that Jesus won for me? As I listen to the Word of God, do I see it as a means, an instrument for salvation?

How important for me to be delighted by the message of this pair of evangelizers as they direct the Word of God to me.

1 Lectura: Hch 13, 14. 43-52: Sepan que nos dedicamos a los gentiles

2 Lectura: Ap 7, 9. 14b-17: El Cordero será su pastor, y los conducirá hacia fuentes de aguas vivas

Evangelio: Jn 10, 27-30: El Padre y yo somos uno

"Mis ovejas escuchan mi voz, y yo las conozco"

Hoy , la mirada de Jesús sobre los hombres es la mirada del Buen Pastor, que toma bajo su responsabilidad a las ovejas que le son confiadas y se ocupa de cada una de ellas. Entre Él y ellas crea un vínculo, un instinto de conocimiento y de fidelidad: «Escuchan mi voz, y yo las conozco y ellas me siguen». La voz del Buen Pastor es siempre una llamada a seguirlo, a entrar en su círculo magnético de influencia.

Cristo nos ha ganado no solamente con su ejemplo y con su doctrina, sino con el precio de su Sangre. Le hemos costado mucho, y por eso no quiere que nadie de los suyos se pierda. Y, con todo, la evidencia se impone: unos siguen la llamada del Buen Pastor y otros no. El anuncio del Evangelio a unos les produce rabia y a otros alegría. ¿Qué tienen unos que no tengan los otros? San Agustín, ante el misterio abismal de la elección divina, respondía: «Dios no te deja, si tú no le dejas»; no te abandonará, si tu no le abandonas. No des, por tanto, la culpa a Dios, ni a la Iglesia, ni a los otros, porque el problema de tu fidelidad es tuyo. Dios no niega a nadie su gracia, y ésta es nuestra fuerza: agarrarnos fuerte a la gracia de Dios. No es ningún mérito nuestro; simplemente, hemos sido "agraciados".

La fe entra por el oído, por la audición de la Palabra del Señor, y el peligro más grande que tenemos es la sordera, no oír la voz del Buen Pastor, porque tenemos la cabeza llena de ruidos y de otras voces discordantes, o lo que todavía es más grave, aquello que los Ejercicios de san Ignacio dicen «hacerse el

sordo», saber que Dios te llama y no darse por aludido. Aquel que se cierra a la llamada de Dios conscientemente, reiteradamente, pierde la sintonía con Jesús y perderá la alegría de ser cristiano para ir a pastar a otras pasturas que no sacian ni dan la vida eterna. Sin embargo, Él es el único que ha podido decir: «Yo les doy la vida eterna».

ORACION: *Dios Padre nuestro, que enviaste a tu Hijo Jesús como Buen Pastor que dio su vida por la ovejas: te pedimos nos des muchos pastores según tu corazón, para que, animados por el ejemplo de Jesús, conduzcan a tu pueblo con decisión por los nuevos caminos que los tiempos actuales requieren. por Jesucristo Nuestro Señor. Amen.*
