A FRESH PERSPECTIVE ON THE SUNDAY READINGS

HIS WORD TODAY by Rev. William J. Reilly

BAPTISM OF THE LORD, January 10, 2010

"I take it you know what has been reported all over Judea about Jesus of Nazareth, beginning in Galilee with the baptism John preached; of the way God anointed Him with the Holy Spirit and power. He went about doing good works and healing all who were in the grip of the devil, and God was with Him"... "You are my beloved Son. On you my favor rests."

Peter used a gathering in the home of Cornelius to give a profound talk and teaching. In a few short words he tells of Jesus' call, mission, His giftedness with the spirit and power or grace. Because of these attributes, He launched His mission of teaching, healing and doing good works. Rather than stating that He is the Son of God, Peter indicates that God accompanied Him.

The mission of Jesus has moved from Galilee to an entire world. Others have been chosen to continue His ministry. In this 'year for priests' we acknowledge the unique role in continuing this same work of Jesus, most especially in providing the Eucharist. Yet the preaching, teaching, healing, all the good works are part of the life of our church and are the responsibility of all the baptized. When we observe the life of the church today providing education, health care, family support and all the corporal works of mercy, we discover the mission of Jesus at work among us.

As Peter described the life and times of Jesus, may we observe how this same mission continues today. May we see our role in continuing the work of Jesus, going about 'doing good works.'

BAUTISMO DEL SEÑOR.

LECTURAS PARA EL DÍA DE HOY:

1 Lectura: Is 42, 1-4. 6-7: El Siervo de Yavé

2 Lectura: Hch 10, 34-38: Ungido por Dios con la fuerza del Espíritu Santo

Evangelio: Lc 3, 15-16. 21-22: Bautismo de Jesús. Tú eres mi hijo, mi predilecto

“Tú eres mi hijo; yo hoy te he engendrado”



Hoy, contemplamos a Jesús ya adulto. El niño del Pesebre se hace un hombre completo, maduro y respetable, y llega el momento en el que ha de trabajar en la obra que el Padre le ha confiado. Así es como le encontramos en el Jordán en el momento de empezar esta labor: uno más en la fila de aquellos contemporáneos suyos que iban a escuchar a Juan y a pedirle el baño del bautismo, como signo de purificación y renovación interior.

Allí, Jesús es descubierto y señalado por Dios: «Puesto en oración, se abrió el cielo, y bajó sobre Él el Espíritu Santo en forma corporal, como una paloma; y vino una voz del cielo: 'Tú eres mi hijo; yo hoy te he engendrado'». Es la etapa preparatoria del gran camino que está dispuesto a emprender y que le conducirá hasta la Cruz. Es el primer acto de su vida pública, su investidura como Mesías.

Es también el comienzo de su modo de actuar: no obrará con violencia, ni con gritos y asperezas, sino con silencio y suavidad. No cortará la caña quebrada, sino que la ayudará a mantenerse firme. Abrirá los ojos a los ciegos y librá a los cautivos. Las señales mesiánicas que describía Isaías, se cumplirán en Él. Nosotros somos los beneficiarios de todas estas cosas porque, como leemos hoy en la carta de san Pablo: «Él nos salvó, no por nuestras buenas obras, sino en virtud de su misericordia, por medio del bautismo regenerador y la renovación del Espíritu Santo que derramó abundantemente sobre nosotros. De este

modo, salvados por su gracia, Dios nos hace herederos conforme a la esperanza que tenemos de alcanzar la vida eterna».

La fiesta del Bautismo de Jesús debe ayudarnos a recordar nuestro propio Bautismo y los compromisos que por nosotros tomaron nuestros padres y padrinos al presentarnos en la Iglesia para hacernos discípulos de Jesús: «El Bautismo nos ha liberado de todos los males, que son los pecados, pero con la gracia de Dios debemos cumplir todo lo bueno».
