A Fresh Perspective On The Sunday Readings His Word Today by Rev. William J. Reilly

“For you were called for freedom, brothers and sisters. But do not use this freedom as an opportunity for the flesh; rather, serve one another through love. For the whole law is fulfilled in one statement, namely, ‘you shall love your neighbor as yourself.’... ‘I say then, live by the Spirit...’

Jewish people pause five times each day and repeat the basic teaching to love God with all their heart, soul and mind. Muslims pause five times daily to pray. We begin and end our day with morning and evening prayer often planning our day and examining our conscience.

The great commandment of love of God and neighbor summarizes the ten given to Moses on Mt. Sinai. (Often artists place the first three on one tablet, the second seven on the second. The first speaks of our relationship with God and the latter, with our neighbor.) Jesus tells us that love for one another is the single great commandment.

Discipleship of Jesus is founded on one word **RESPECT** or love. Learn the commandments this way: I RESPECT God, His Name, His day. I respect authority, life, my sexuality and that of others, property and the truth. I respect other people, their values and am satisfied with God's gifts to me. All are positive statements for living the Christian life. It is not what I cannot do, but what I am called to do.

Jesus taught us the commandments through the beatitudes, with a duty and a reward. For reason Paul tells me today ‘live by the Spirit.’

“SIGUEME”

Hoy, el Evangelio nos invita a reflexionar sobre nuestro seguimiento de Cristo. Importa saber seguirlo como Él lo espera. Santiago y Juan aún no habían aprendido el mensaje de amor y de perdón: «Señor, ¿quieres que baje fuego del cielo y los consuma?» Los otros convocados aún no se desprendían realmente de sus lazos familiares. Para seguir a Jesucristo y cumplir con nuestra misión, hay que hacerlo libres de toda atadura.

Si nos sentimos verdaderos hermanos, podremos comenzar a comprendernos y a dialogar con respeto. El Papa ha subrayado que el empeño por un diálogo atento y respetuoso es una condición para un auténtico testimonio del amor salvífico de Dios, porque quien perdona abre el corazón a los demás y se hace capaz de amar. El Señor nos lo dejó dicho en la Última Cena: «Que os améis los unos a los otros, así como Yo os he amado. En esto reconocerán todos que sois discípulos míos» .

Evangelizar es tarea de todos, aunque de modo diferente. Para algunos será acudir a muchos países donde aún no conocen a Jesús. A otros, en cambio, les corresponde evangelizar a su alrededor. Preguntémonos, por ejemplo, si quienes nos rodean saben y viven las verdades fundamentales de nuestra fe. Todos podemos y debemos apoyar, con nuestra oración, sacrificio y acción, la labor misionera, además del testimonio de nuestro perdón y comprensión para con los demás.

Oración: Dios Padre nuestro: tu Hijo Jesús, “decidió subir resueltamente a Jerusalén”, sin importarle todo lo que aquel camino le iba a acarrear de sufrimiento y de cruz; ayúdanos, a los que queremos ser seguidores radicales tuyos, a tomar también resueltamente la opción de dar nuestra vida día a día en el servicio a la Causa que él con su entrega nos mostró.
