Lenten Information

Fasting – prescribes only one full meal plus two small ones to maintain strength. The two small meals should not equal a full meal in quantity. Obliges from 18th to 59th birthdays.

Abstinence forbids eating meat on a particular day. Obliges from 14th birthday.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast and abstinence.

All Fridays in Lent are days of abstinence. There is a serious obligation to observe these penitential practices in a serious way.

1 Lectura: Is 43, 16-21: Miren que realizo algo nuevo.

2 Lectura: Flp 3, 8-14: Todo es nada, comparado con el conocimiento de Jesus.

Evangelio: Jn 8, 1-11: Quien este sin pecado, que tire la primera piedra.

"Padre, pequé contra el cielo y ante ti"

Hoy , Somos tan prontos a juzgar y condenar, nosotros los hombres. ¡Es tan fácil en este caso! Nada menos que una adúltera, descubierta en plena infidelidad. Hay que aplicarle el rigor de la ley: ¡debe ser apedreada! De paso, veremos cuánto de fiel a la ley es Jesús. La actitud del Señor no parece ser muy atenta; casi, hasta parece indiferente. Juzgar y condenar, en nuestras actitudes, muchas veces van de la mano, se le parecen. Los hombres ya condenaron, falta que hable Jesús, para condenarlo también a él.

¿Sexo? ¡Horror! Para tantos, todavía sigue siendo el más grave y horroroso de los pecados. Es cierto que muchas veces nos hemos ido al otro extremo, y no hablamos ya del tema, pero cuántas veces nos encontramos con actitudes o comentarios que parecen que el único pecado existente es el pecado sexual. La envidia, la ambición, la falta de solidaridad, la injusticia, la soberbia, y tantos otros, parecen no existir en la "lista". El sexo es "el" pecado. Esa es, también, la actitud de los acusadores de la mujer: fue descubierta en pleno pecado, ¡debe ser apedreada! "*Muy bien, el que no tenga pecado, tire la primera piedra*". Y, casualmente, los primeros en retirarse son los ancianos, los que ya no tienen "ese" pecado. Muchos pecados hay, no uno, pero nosotros juzgamos, ¡y hasta condenamos!. A Jesús no le importaban (los) detalles legalistas; Él ama, ha venido precisamente para salvar a los pecadores. convertirla es mucho mejor que apedrearla, ordenarla y salvarla es mucho mejor que condenarla. Las fuentes del pecado social están en el corazón del hombre. nadie quiere echarse la culpa y todos son responsables de la ola de crímenes y violencia, la salvación comienza arrancando del pecado a cada hombre. "No peques mas"
