**Bicentennial Campaign**

Thanks to your generosity, we have received an additional \$8,606 from the Bicentennial Campaign. This brings the total distribution we have received since the campaign began in April 2006 to \$357,966.49. We have accomplished much since the Campaign began and appreciate your support. We hope that everyone who has an outstanding balance will make every effort to complete payment on their pledges on time. We will make a complete report to you before summer.

**The 2010 Archdiocesan Stewardship Appeal**

As of May 7, 207 of our parishioners have generously pledged \$49,185.35 (and paid \$38,492.35) toward our parish goal of \$43,000. We have exceeded our goal! Pledges may be paid over a five-month period. If you choose this option, reminder bills will be sent directly to you from the Appeal Office each month. Keep in mind that the Appeal supports Academic and Religious formation, Formation of our clergy, Care for retired priests and religious, and Works of Charity as well as Catholic education.
